

Frederick County's Budget Book Unification Project




Like many public sector budget departments, the team at Frederick County spent an inordinate amount of time compiling data across multiple platforms to prepare their adopted and capital budget books. We interviewed Budget Analyst III Tanya Kauffman, to learn more about how the county's disjointed systems impacted the budget department and the project they undertook to solve the problem.

Stitching together the Budget Book

We kicked-off the interview by asking Tanya how the County had prepared its budget book prior to the project, and specifically what problems they were looking to solve.

The Manual Process

CHALLENGE

Frederick County spent countless hours gathering and reconciling pieces of their budget book across multiple applications. Every change or update would require a time-consuming review.

SOLUTION

Engaging the services of FHB, Microsoft and Adobe solutions were replaced with Caseware — integrated with Questica Budget. Changes applied to the budget are made in Questica and flow through to the book.

RESULTS

The County unified its budget book under a single comprehensive solution resulting in increased confidence in the data and an estimated 25% reduction in preparation time.
